

AN OBSCURE VIRGINIA TOKEN MERCHANT David E. Schenkman



Very little is known concerning the life of A. W. Hanmer. My Internet search took me a page on the WikiTree.com web site, where I learned that Alfred W. Hanmer was born in 1867 in Wetherfield, Connecticut, and that "he was a tradesmas (sic) and was located at 606 East Broad Street, Richmond, VA. A. W. Hanmer produced trade tokens made of aluminum." This was seemingly contradicted by the statement that in 1892 he went into partnership with Charles Bulkley in the grocery business, and that "in 1900, he bought out his partner's interest and continued to operate the store at 1654 Main Street, next to the Fire House for 40 years or more."

I decided that further research was needed, and as it turned out, Richmond's Alfred W. Hanmer was born in Michigan on January 22, 1839. Little is known about him except for the fact that he enlisted in the army in August 1862, and served with Company C, 24th Michigan Infantry. He was discharged ten months later. He was married to Henrietta Berdan. In 1887 Hanmer, who at the time was employed by the Ypsilanti Oat Company, was sued by a customer, Abram Pittsworth. Hanmer had sold the customer twenty bushels of Bohemian oats in 1885 and had promised him forty bushels from the 1886 harvest, which were paid for and not delivered. The Genesee Circuit Court ruled against Hanmer, finding that he had obtained the customer's signature under false pretenses. Hanmer was sentenced to "two years at Ionia or a fine of \$250." The February 4, 1887 issue of the Ann Arbor Democrat noted that "A. W. Hanmer, the Bohemian oats fraud, was in Holly the last of the week, but he lingered only a short time, and was glad to escape with nothing more serious than a black eye." I haven't been able to determine just when Hanmer moved to Richmond. He isn't listed in the 1894-1895 city directory, so a logical assumption is that it was a year or two after that.



The earliest notice of his business that I've found was in the September 26, 1897 issue of The Jewish South, a Richmond newspaper, where he introduces his "method of soliciting trade for business firms." In the ad he invites merchants to examine his system carefully, stating that "it will interest every progressive business man, and will increase the trade of every one who adopts the method." He added that "orders for 50,000 Boxes, 50,000 Books, and 200,000 Aluminum Checks have been placed with different Richmond firms." The obverse legend on most of the tokens is A. W. HANMER'S / METHOD / OF / SOLICITING TRADE / FOR / BUSINESS FIRMS. On the reverse. COPYRIGHTED is around the rim at the top, with 10 CTS. (or other denomination) in the center. The year, 1897, is at the bottom. 10¢. 15¢, 25¢, \$1.00, and \$5.00 denominations of the tokens, all of which are 25mm and struck in aluminum, are known. They are listed in the second edition of Virginia Tokens as R6820-H10 and R6820-H10 through H500. Surprisingly, there are three varieties of the of the 10ϕ token, one of which has A.W. HANMER'S / 10 CTS. / METHOD on This suggests that Hanmer was selling a very large its obverse. quantity of them to merchants and needed to reorder.



In a short advertisement in the November 25, 1897 Jewish South, it was announced that "Mr. Harry M. Reinhard has associated himself with Mr. A. W. Hanmer in the 'trading check' business, and would be glad to have his friends call on him at their show-rooms, 66 East Broad Street." Other than that, and a few large newspaper advertisements Hanmer placed between September 1897 and January 1898, I've found no mention of him or his new company.



Hanmer's tokens were actually metal coupons which could be redeemed for prizes when the required amount was acquired. In an ad published on October 23, 1897, it states that "we offer a special premium to the first lady or gentleman who brings to our store one hundred dollars' worth of the little shiners." Also mentioned was the fact that they had "added to our premiums a first class piano, which you can get by saving the required amount." The "amount" wasn't mentioned, but I feel sure it was quite a bit more than anyone could accumulate during the short time Hanmer's establishment was open for business.



Very likely Hanmer got the idea for his business from the Sperry and Hutchinson company, which had started operating in 1896. Grocery stores, department stores, gas stations, and other types of businesses could purchase the "S&H Green Stamps" from the company and give them to customers, based on the amount of their purchases. Sperry and Hutchinson published catalogs describing the numerous products that were available and specified the number of stamps that had to be sent to the company for each one. Hanmer advertised that his tokens "will neither rip, ravel, nor tear." This was an obvious effort to set them apart from the S&H paper stamps. Evidently the "trading check" business was not successful, and within a couple of years Hanmer was back in Michigan. The November 3, 1899 issue of The Yale Expositor, a Yale, Michigan newspaper, reported that "Alfred Hanmer, special rural free mail delivery agent, on the 25th selected a route running southwest through Saline and Bridgewater townships, 30 miles long and covering 25 square miles." Hanmer died on December 8, 1918. His wife, Henrietta, died ten years earlier. They are both buried at the Highland Cemetery in Ypsilanti.
