petitioned for Hebrews to leave Babylonian exile and return to Jerusalem to rebuild its walls and renew the covenant.

COLLECTING COINS OF CHRISTIAN HISTORY

Tom Kays

Tom Wood, a North Carolina ancient coin dealer and proprietor of “Coins of the Holy Land” specializes in ancient Judaeen and Biblical coins. Tom gave an inspiring presentation to young numismatists last year at the 2025 VNA Convention, Coin and Currency Show and plans to attend the 2026 VNA Convention in Fredericksburg. During the past thirty years Tom has been a youth minister, and made ancient coin presentations at dozens of churches, civic groups, scouting groups, home school classes, and national coin shows. He enjoys helping folks build ancient coin collections and sharing historical stories. To make his presentations even more memorable he passes around many genuine ancient coins during his talks to youngsters such as the following touchstones to Christian history.



“Tribute Penny” – Silver Denarius of Roman Emperor Tiberius Caesar (15 – 37 AD) with his mother Livia as PAX seated on the reverse and PONTIFEX MAXIMUS that proclaims Tiberius high priest of the Church of Rome. When asked in Mark 12 and Matthew 22 if it is lawful to pay taxes to Rome, Jesus asked for a coin and seeing an image of the Roman Emperor, said “Render unto Caesar what is Caesars and to God what is God’s.”

This is always an eye-opener that coins of Biblical figures exist today, helping to make the Gospels tangible when you hold an ancient coin in your hand and wonder at its history. Surprising too, these ancient relics can be collected by beginners with limited means. As recent prices of gold and silver bullion spiked, ancient coins barely felt the effect. For the cost of a 1964 Kennedy half dollar, one could buy ancient Roman or Judean bronze, and for the cost of a Peace dollar one could buy an ancient Roman silver denarius.



“Widow’s Mite (Lepton)” – These are small bronze coins of the Hasmonean Dynasty that long circulated in Judea in the first century BC issued for Roman Governor Alexander Jannaeus (103 – 76 BC) with both Greek and Hebrew legends showing an eight-rayed diadem and anchor, as mentioned by Jesus in Mark 12:41-44.

Tom Wood offers first time buyers of “Christian History” coins, illustrated collector guides detailing specialty, twenty-coin starter sets, such as “Christian History (from Nehemiah to King James),” “Constantine and his Family (first Christian Roman Emperor),” “Images of Christ,” and “Cities of the Books of Acts/Revelation.”



Herod the Great– King of the Jews under Roman rule at the time of Jesus birth (40 – 4 BC) bronze prutah with double cornucopia and caduceus / anchor



Antonius Felix bronze prutah of 54 AD. He was Judean Procurator under Claudius. Minted in Jerusalem with two shields and two spears / palm tree and “BRIT”– He imprisons Paul per the Book of Acts 21.



Bronze Prutah of Portius Festus, Procurator in Judea under Nero in (58 – 62 AD) Minted in Caesarea Maritima (Roman Capitol in Judea) in the fifth year of Nero (58/59 AD) – Per the Book of Acts 25:4 – 12 he contends with Paul to stand trial in Jerusalem but Paul appeals to Caesar, thereby sending him to Rome.



Constantine I “the Great” first Christian emperor of Rome (306 – 337 AD) bronze follis with Camp Gate reverse and PROVIDENTIA AVGG (Foresight of the Augustii)



Bronze Follis of Empress Helena (AD 324 – 330) the mother of Constantine the Great and considered “Saint Helena of Constantinople” to many Christians for her pilgrimages in the Holy Land, spreading of Christianity, and seeking holy relics with “Securitas” reverse.

The capital of the Roman empire moved to Constantinople in 476 AD and Byzantine emperors carried on with Christianity in the Holy Roman Empire in the east. As the thousand years mark since Christ approached, the Byzantine Emperor John I Tzimisces (969 – 976 AD) heeded Jesus teaching in Mark 12 and Matthew 22 about whose image appears on coins and decided to put his name but an image of Christ on bronze coins. The Christ image proved popular and soon the king’s name was left off.



Byzantine bronze “Anonymous Follis” attributed to Romanus IV (1068 – 1071 AD), Thompson Class G, with a facing Christ with nimbus, holding scroll of the Gospels and figure of the Virgin Mary with nimbus

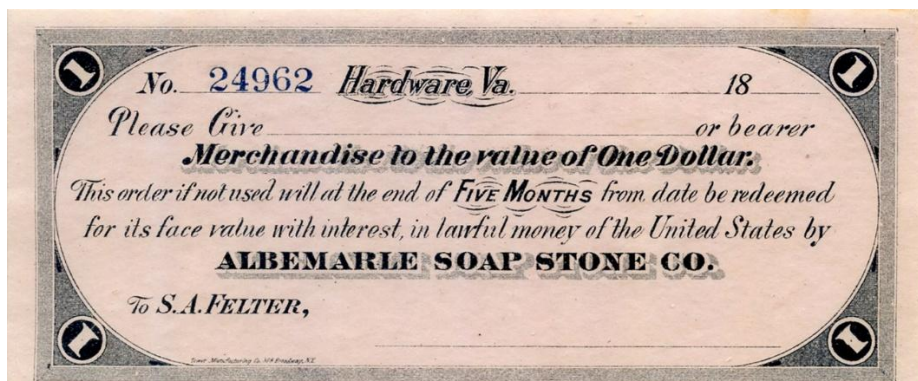

SOAPSTONE MINING IN VIRGINIA

Although the Albemarle Soap Stone Company was incorporated on June 6, 1922 in Albemarle County, Virginia, its history can be traced back nearly forty years earlier, when it was organized to mine soapstone at Johnson’s Mill Gap, a village in Virginia which, by the 1890s had been renamed Alberene, (a combination of Albemarle County and James Serene, one of the company’s owners). Albermarle County contained the world’s largest deposits of soapstone, and the town that grew up around the mine was a company town, and the chimneys and foundations of its houses were constructed by the company using soapstone scraps. By 1900 about 250 workers were employed by the company and living in Alberene.

During the late 1800s the company started using paper scrip, and the illustrated one-dollar denomination was redeemable for face value plus interest “at the end of five months from date.”



According to the person I purchased this from, it “came from a hoard of 281 notes sold from the collection of the University of Virginia library. It is unused. There was only one used note in the hoard - serial number 10029, which was dated 1888.” The location shown on the note is Hardware, Virginia, a town located in Fluvanna County about forty miles from Albemarle. I have no explanation for that, but likely the company’s offices were located there at the time.



The Alberene Store issued metal tokens, and they are quite a bit rarer than the paper note. In the second edition of Virginia Tokens, I listed one through fifty cents denominations, all struck in aluminum, as A1060 L5- through L5-50. This was the company store for the Virginia Soapstone Company, and aluminum tokens were also issued for the company’s store in Shuyler (Nelson County) Virginia. This store was in operation from early 1890s until about 1916. The Virginia Soapstone Company was a competitor of the Albemarle Soap Stone Company, but I imagine the tokens were used by employees of both enterprises. In 1904 they merged, when the latter company

purchased the Virginia Soapstone Company, and four years later their headquarters were moved to Schuyler. The company continued to operate under both names.

The Albemarle Soapstone Slate Co. near Charlottesville, shipped last week a carload of slate pencils to J. B. Lippincott & Co., of Philadelphia. The car contained 1,160,000 pencils which weighed 27,390 pounds.

December 11, 1891 issue of the Rockingham Register, a Harrisonburg newspaper.

According to the website <https://www.tclf.org/quarry-gardens-schuyler>, by the 1920s the company was one of the three largest soapstone operations in the world. It continued to operate until 2014, when it was purchased by Polycor, Inc., the largest stone quarrier in the world. The company was founded in 1987 in Québec, Canada, and it operated more than fifty quarries, employing more than thirteen hundred people.

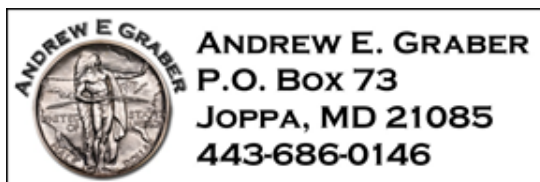
